Hate Crimes Legislation Scorecard

The national spotlight on social injustice prompted renewed local attention to House Bill 426, commonly known as the Hate Crimes Bill. With Georgia remaining one of a handful of states without a comprehensive hate crimes law on the books, the Gwinnett Chamber led a joint statement of support with the Korean-American Chamber of Commerce of Atlanta-Georgia, the Georgia Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, and the Chinese Business Association of Atlanta. The chamber also joined over 500 companies to urge our state legislators to pass HB426. Governor Kemp signed HB426 into law.
