The Gwinnett Chamber champions business and 2022 only served to propel that mission to a new level of expectation. After 75 years in business, the Gwinnett Chamber now boasts the most diverse board of directors in its history. We held our second annual Multi-Chamber Mixer with more than a dozen bi-lateral chamber partners, continued to champion women leadership through the MOXIE Awards that recognized 100 finalists across 10 categories, and honored Gwinnett's 35-Under-35 young professionals at the Gwinnett Young Professionals (GYP) "TheYParty" event. The community and economic development initiative, Partnership Gwinnett, reported its most successful year yet with 3,854 new jobs representing \$149.3M in private capital investment. And the culminating achievement for 2022 was earning our firstever, 5-Star Accreditation rating from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, placing us in the top one percent of all chambers in the nation.

We appreciate our members, investors, and partners who worked hard to champion business with us and made 2022 a true gem of a 'diamond anniversary' year for the Gwinnett Chamber.



The 2021-2022 A-List cycle brought in more than 50 new members, numerous sponsorships and more than \$430,000 in revenue. Those who qualified enjoyed a trip to Ireland in May of 2022.



CHAIRMAN'S CLUB

The Gwinnett Chamber welcomed 64 new Chairman's Club members in 2022 and announced the launch of its first-ever EMBARK program, a shared travel experience between corporate executives to renowned global destinations.

The Gwinnett Chamber serves a community with an 84.4% diversity index, boasts the most diverse board of directors in the organization's history, and works to maintain an inclusive approach to business.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



DRIVING BUSINESS

In 2022, Partnership Gwinnett — the community economic development initiative and extension of the Gwinnett Chamber - reported 26 project wins for a total of 3,854 new jobs and \$149.3M in capital investment.



DRIVING TALENT

Partnership Gwinnett collaborated with more than 35 industry businesses in Gwinnett on workforce needs and formed 25 external partnerships to further research, upskilling and talent development in the region.



DRIVING COMMUNITY

Partnership Gwinnett supported city and county partners to market 13.1M square feet of available commercial real estate and tracked roughly 2.7M square feet of new commercial construction in Gwinnett.



DRIVING THE FUTURE

The Partnership Gwinnett public private initiative launched its fourth, five-year strategic plan to grow jobs, develop talent, and build community in the Greater Gwinnett region.

Inclusion



FOUNDATION

The Gwinnett Chamber Foundation was established in 2022 to advance equitable and inclusive business education and business leadership development through programming and grant-making to all eligible business organizations.



MULTI-CHAMBER MIXER

The Chamber worked in partnership with thirteen other strategic business organizations to host the second annual Multi-Chamber Mixer. The event also featured a wide range of authentic global cuisine from 16 Gwinnett-based restauranteurs.



DEI SUMMIT

Speakers addressed talent and business trends around Gwinnett's 81% diversity index. Aisha DeBerry, DEI Manager for Gas South moderated the panels and District 4 Commissioner Marlene Fosque delivered the closing address.



YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

GYP held 42 events in 2022 hosting more than 1,150 engaged participants for programs like Journey Leadership Institute, TheYParty 35-Under-35, Off the Clock, and our ongoing Grow/Impact/Connect events.

Advocacy



PUBLIC POLICY AGENDA

The Gwinnett Chamber Public Policy team introduced a robust agenda for the 2022 Legislative Session and successfully navigated a grassroots campaign to support the passage of Gwinnett County's SPLOST for another five years.



HEARING FROM LEADERS

Gwinnett Chamber hosted "candidate forums" for both the Gwinnett County School Board and Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners elections, allowing business leaders the opportunity to hear from and ask questions of the candidates.



THE VOICE OF BUSINESS

The Gwinnett Chamber conducted its annual D.C. Fly-In in December of 2022, leading 40 delegates to the nation's Capital to hear from Congressional Leaders and receive the official Five-Star designation from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.



THE GWINNETT FUND

The Gwinnett Chamber Public Policy Committee also formalized a new 501c4, The Gwinnett Fund, designed to support public policy issues that would preserve Gwinnett's best-in-class business climate.

5-Star Accreditation


The Gwinnett Chamber earned its Five-Star Accreditation from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. This designation is a "first" for the Gwinnett Chamber and was awarded for the organization's sound policies, effective procedures, and positive impact in the community.

The Gwinnett Chamber worked through a six-month process to complete a 200-plus page application measuring organizational activity across nine different areas. Of the 7,000-plus chambers of commerce across the nation, only 201 are accredited and even fewer have received Five-Star status. The Gwinnett Chamber ranks among the top one percent of those who have achieved Five-Star Accreditation.
